Our Theme

Our theme for Summer Term is "Happy Campers".

Have a look below at how we will be learning about camping holidays and the environment across our curriculum!



In My Communication we will be studying creative writing this term. We will use colourful semantics tools to help us to structure our sentences, then we will edit our work and select the most effective descriptive vocabulary for our sentence. We will use roleplay and hot-seating to explore how different characters might feel throughout a story. We will create our own main character, giving them a name and writing a description of them. We will then plan and write a story based around this character and a key event, putting all of our descriptive writing skills into practise. We will continue to focus on developing our expressive and receptive language skills using board games, lego therapy and chatter mats to support us. We will be working on reading, writing and



communication and interaction ALI's across the timetable.

The World about Me

In The World about Me, we will be focusing on animals and their habitats. We will explore our school ground to observe the wildlife around us and we will investigate the qualities of our outdoor areas that make a suitable habitat for different types of animals. We will learn about different biomes around the world, using technology to investigate these from our classroom.



My Thinking and Problem Solving

In My Thinking and Problem Solving we will be developing our skills across the areas of number and measure. We will explore standard and non-standard units to measure length, mass and capacity. We will compare measurements and order items according to

their size. We will also try to estimate some measurements before checking to see if we were close. In Computing we will be using laptops to develop our keyboard skills through touch typing activities.

In Maths we will continue to focus on money every day through our breakfast cafe in class and through our community visits to Asda and the café.

We will also be working on My Thinking and Problem Solving ALI's across the curriculum.



In Me and My Body, we will be taking part in lots of physical activity across the timetable. We will focus on athletics and ball games in our PE lessons. We will be paying close attention to how our bodies feel when we exercise.

We will be thinking about our mental health and we will talk often about how we are feeling. We will explore a variety of regulation activities so that our young people can learn which activities are most effective for them to use. We will continue to learn about the 'Zones of Regulation' and how to select a tool from our tool kit to help us to manage our emotions.



In My Community, we will be continuing to develop our travel skills through community visits and by walking with



In My Creativity, we will be focusing on Design Technology and Sewing & Textiles. We will investigate

more independence around school and the school grounds. Our key focus will be 'Looking After Our School', where we will learn about the importance of teamwork and cooperation in order to look after our environment together. We will investigate areas of the school and identify key areas that we can work towards improving. We will collaborate with the school site team to improve our school, developing key functional skills along the way. We will take pride in our gardening projects, working together to nurture our plants to grow. Throughout the term we will also continue our ongoing work about the importance of staying safe at home, in the community and online.
