


# 8P Class Newsletter Spring term






#### **Our Theme**

# My Communication





# **My Thinking and Problem Solving**

In My Thinking and Problem Solving, we will be learning essential time facts, essential time-related skills including sequencing daily activities, and learning how to tell and write the time in analogue form, starting with o'clock times. We will cover our number objectives in focused groupings. 8P will be using money in our pretend Cinema in class and learning how to give coins in exchange for a 'ticket'. The children will be encouraged to start to work on identifying coins through this regular role-play. We will be working on number and cognition and learning ALIs across the timetable also.



#### The World about Me

In The World about Me, we will be learning about digital photography through our movies topic. We will also learn about Light and Sound in our Science lessons. We will teach the children independent skills through our weekly supermarket visits, including a focus on travel training. We will be practising our dressing skills when attending our swimming lesson weekly this half term and when changing for PE after February break.



## Me and My Body

In Me and My Body, we will be taking part in lots of physical activities across the timetable. In our PE lessons, we will be focusing on Net and Wall Games at first, then Dance after the February break. In PSHE, we will be covering one of our sex education topics this term. The content of the lessons will be sent each half term via an Edulink message from Miss Buck.



In My Community, we will be developing our independence in travel around the school and the local community. We will be learning to walk safely with adults into Chorley town centre. We will learn routines when paying for things/experiences in real life! We will be visiting a different supermarket weekly this half term, on Wednesday afternoons. We will alternate between ASDA, Tesco and Morrisons each week. Next half term, we are hoping to be able to do some cinema visits, this depends on if the timings fit but we will keep you updated.



This term, the children will be learning about music, dance and drama, with a particular focus on:

- Learning key My Dance and My Drama skills
- Music of the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries, including exploring film music in particular
  - Composing and performing basic dance sequences



- ✓ We have PE on a Monday. Please send your child in their PE kits on Mondays for this half term. After the February break, please send your child's PE kit bag in weekly.
- Swimming is on a Tuesday morning until the February half-term break. Please send in swimming kits on Tuesday each week.
- ✓ We will be going on weekly visit to a supermarket on Wednesdays. We will alternate which supermarket we visit each week. Please send in warm coats and appropriate footwear for walking.
- ✓ Please remember to check Evidence for Learning and the School Website Blog on a weekly basis to see your child's learning across the curriculum.
