

10A Class Newsletter Spring 1



Within English this term we will be looking at the theme of Literacy for Life and Leisure. We will be looking at all aspects of Leisure available in the community. We will continue to look at using adjectives in building sentence structures.

We will continue to focus on alphabet sounds and alphabetical ordering.

Within Reading we are continuing to follow personalised reading patterns with a mixture of 1:1 and group reading. Pupils have been grouped with peers of a similar reading ability. Reading packs will be coming home this term with activity sheets to complement their reading ability. Please can you encourage where possible for this to be completed independently. Reading packs will need to return to school daily, as the books are those, we read in class too. There will be a reading record book for you to make any comments and a log of reading at home.

We will also be developing specific communication and social skills intervention groups to provide structured time for pupils to practice these skills.



My Thinking and Problem Solving

For our maths this term we are looking at recognising time through regular events of the Day, Months and Seasons of the year. For those working at Entry Level we will be learning about time, measurement and number, practicing these on our community visits including weekly shopping and gym sessions.

The theme for science this term is "Forces and Movement" the pupils will be engaged with a range of activities. These will include investigating friction which will allow the pupils to apply this terms numeracy knowledge of measurement and time.



This term we will be looking to complete the two PSD ASDAN modules Healthy Living and Making The Most of Leisure Time which has utilised our visit to Bendrigg Trust.

In addition, we will commence work on further modules including:

- . Personal Safety in The Home and The Community
- . Using Technology in The Home and the Community
- . Parental Awareness

In addition, work on the module Preparation for Work has started and will be completed in the next academic year.

We have linked topics from the Personal Progress curriculum for pupils working at this level that match the subject matter of the PSD modules being completed.



In My Community, we will continue to access the community. This will include visits to local facilities within Chorley Town Centre, including the gym at All Seasons and weekly shopping trips. Pupils can use their own money to access snacks and drinks in local cafes. We cap spending money at £3.
