LEARNING OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM POLICY

Vision for Learning Outside the Classroom

Astley Park School believes that students learn best when they are given the opportunity to engage in challenging tasks across a range of stimulating contexts. This should include the National Curriculum along with the wider curriculum we feel our students should explore. Learning should not only take place within the classroom and at prescribed times, but also through safe opportunities to explore the wider world. This allows our student's tangible opportunities for their curriculum developed skills to be practiced while supporting the transfer of their knowledge in a variety of contexts and locations.

We consider giving Astley Park pupils the capability and confidence to explore new and exciting opportunities which are essential in developing their desire for lifelong. This will help further develop self-esteem and self-confidence which will contribute to greater prospects and opportunities when they move on to their next chapter in their learning journey.

Rationale

This policy is required in order that the current management and future development of the wider curriculum can provide well-structured opportunities for students to learn outside of the classroom. Through this policy, it is intended that Astley Park School will aspire to:

- Develop students' independence and an outward looking attitude to life
